PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

A. Since the school's curriculum, course schedules and instructor/classroom availability are subject to change, this plan does not contractually guarantee access to specific courses in the sequence listed or graduation by a specific date or semester. The term "elective" is intended to merely suggest that you schedule the elective course(s) of your choosing from the course offerings available and does not guarantee access to any specific elective(s) or that specific elective(s) will be offered in any given academic term.

B. Under all circumstances, you are responsible for ensuring that all requirements for graduation listed in the current Student Handbook are satisfied. There is no "grandfather clause," and BSL reserves the right to modify the academic curriculum at any time. A copy of the current Student Handbook is published and dated on the BSL law school website. All courses must be completed within six (6) years of your initial enrollment date to receive academic credit for graduation. Likewise, transfer credits may not have been completed more than six (6) years prior to the graduation semester to qualify for academic credit.

C. Please carefully review your graduation plan for completeness and accuracy relative to your circumstances. BSL administrators are not responsible for typographical errors, omissions, or your misinterpretation of this plan. If you believe your plan contains an error, please contact the Assistant Dean immediately.

D. You may not increase the number of classes/week unless you have a current GPA of 3.00 and have completed eighteen (18) credit hours. Additionally, because of normal scheduling conflicts that occur later in your matriculation, it may not be possible to accelerate your graduation date. Failing or withdrawing from a course will not generate an automatic revision of your plan. You may be permitted to register for up to **four (4) classes**, with approval from the Dean or Assistant Dean.

E. If changes are made to your class registration after the registration period has closed, enrollment in some courses may be severely limited or denied. Consequently, your graduation date may be affected. You will also incur a late registration penalty.

F. The Upper-Level Writing Requirement ("ULWR") may be fulfilled by taking one of the courses indicated as satisfying the ULWR in the course catalog and handbook. Additionally, when registering in the student portal, the class descriptions indicate if a course satisfies this requirement. A course taken for the ULWR cannot satisfy any additional matriculation requirements.

G. The Skills Course Requirement ("SCR") may be fulfilled by taking one of the courses indicated as satisfying the SCR in the course catalog and handbook. Additionally, when registering in the student portal, the class descriptions indicate if a course satisfies this requirement. A course taken for the SCR cannot satisfy any additional matriculation requirements.

* To pass these courses, you must earn a grade of C- or higher. Failure to earn a grade of at least C- means you must repeat the course until you earn a grade of C- or higher. No elective credit will be given for retaking a class. The passing grade in all other courses without an asterisk is D+. The grade earned on each mini bar exams must be the equivalent of a "C-".
